Rabbi Dave

Good morning, America. How are you? I'm Rabbi Dave, and I feel like. Well. That.

Friar Rod

Good morning, America. This is Friar rods coming to you live from. Well, you know, possibly live, I guess. From Oakdale, CA, where it's nice, sunny and it's going to be a balmy 74 today.

Rabbi Dave

It's a balmy 70 here. But here's the problem with here right now. It's March. Which means that as soon as the sun pokes itself out, all the trees go. Hooray time for tree sex.

Friar Rod

Well, I mean. It's the only time you get it, I guess, right?

Rabbi Dave

Yeah. I guess if I only got it once a year or two, I'd be excited. But the the trees, some of which I have in my yard. Mm-hmm. Have gone.

Rabbi Dave

I mean, literally the sun wasn't even out yet, but they knew it was coming, I think. And they just started. Pollinating. And let me assure you that while I might sound a little under the weather. I am clawing my eyeballs out on a fairly regular basis, yeah.

Friar Rod

I have consistent congestion going on right now, sinus congestion, but we had you know Dave, we went through the almond blossoms a couple of weeks ago. It's actually right before the big rains came. Those are all done now.

Right.

Rabbi Dave

I don't understand that. I had no problems when I was stationed here before. Back in the 80s, no problems at all. Moved to Virginia, which, by the way is pretty pollinated heavily anyway, has no problems there. Moved to Georgia and it about killed me. Then I moved to Modesto. And I moved to Modesto. And. The almonds got me, man.

Friar Rod

Rabbi Dave

Rabbi Dave

By the end of the week, Rod, I mean, today's Sunday, it's the first day of the week right? By the end of this week. I'll be OK. I'll be back to normal. Friar Rod

Yeah.

Rabbi Dave

So anyway, I can't really see anything, so if Rob is making faces at me or flipping me off or. Whatever, I don't really. Know. I do know that I had to spend a lot of money yesterday on my computer systems. I upgraded. I upgraded all the control software for my video systems. And only after I upgraded it all did I discover that it was proprietary and I have to have their webcam. So I had to buy a new webcam, which isn't here yet. It won't be here till later today. So if I look weird, I'm using. It's because I'm using the old system. The new system, once they get it in place, which probably will not be until May, because I'm going to be distracted. Friar Rod

Speaker

OK.

Rabbi Dave

The theory here is that. It's it's really for my show to to, to improve those things, but. Who knows? Because I, you know. I I'm I'm starting to get into that. Weird mode where I'm starting to get panicked about next month, but I don't want to talk about that right now. What I do want to talk about is the fact that Roderick Cook the good fryer. Has been banned by the LDS Church and I just wanted to say welcome to the. Club. What in the I I know what I did to \*\*\*\* him off. What did?

Friar Rod

Friar Rod

Rabbi Dave

Friar Rod

Did well so, so here, here. I'll. I'll continue on from where I did. I'll just do a couple of verses and it's just so that you can get it. So we did. We covered day one in Genesis. Friar Rod

Rabbi Dave

Well, maybe there were Irish pirates.

Friar Rod

They could have.

Rabbi Dave

Irish Bible pirates.

Friar Rod

That would be a Monty Python skit.

Rabbi Dave

Not big on.

Friar Rod

I'm seeing.

Rabbi Dave

Saint Patrick, I'm just not a big Saint, Patrick. 'S day celebration.

Friar Rod

Crimson brigade. What is it? The Crimson insurance. Permanent insurance. That's what it is.

Speaker

Right.

Rabbi Dave

I'm. I don't know I. Number one, I'm not a huge corned beef fan.

Friar Rod

Yeah, I'm not.

Rabbi Dave

Either I used to really like it and then I had a really, really, really bad experience.

Friar Rod

How do you have a bad corned beef experience unless it's?

Rabbi Dave

Mark. 17th St. Patrick's Day 2010. Was the end of my hockey corned beef ended my hockey career houses?

Friar Rod

Uh oh, OK.

Rabbi Dave

Add corned beef for lunch. Went and played hockey that afternoon, evening and I got sick on the rink.

Friar Rod

Uh.

Rabbi Dave

And I never played again. I've never had corned beef again.

Friar Rod

OK, OK. And neither has the Zamboni driver.

Rabbi Dave

So my wife on the. Other hand loves money. My wife, on the other hand, loves corned beef and so every year I have a I have an old shipmate of mine who. Who makes? I don't know how to describe. Homemade corned beef. Is that the best way to describe it?

Friar Rod

Homemade corn, OK.

Rabbi Dave

He buys the he buys the meat and then he does all the Corning stuff. That makes it corned beef, and then he sells. It and. So every year I buy about 3 lbs of it from him the. Because my wife loves. It I can't. I I can't do it. I. Not all that big on tap.

Friar Rod

There are certain things I can't eat either after being sick. Back when I was 12.

Rabbi Dave

That and apple. Apple something some kind of apple liquor. Oh boy, we did that one night. We did that one day on the DUI show with John and I and.

Speaker

That was the.

Rabbi Dave

Only time I ever actually got sick on that show was at Apple. Whatever the hell that was.

Friar Rod

Now for me it's roasted marshmallows and cocoa. I just the smell of either one of those.

Rabbi Dave

Marshmallows. But Coco. Coco. I can take or leave, but I. Prefer coffee so.

Friar Rod

Coffee is great, man. There you.

Rabbi Dave

Anyway, none of this has anything to do with any of the the real issues of the day, no. Which are of. Course we're sending more money to your crane. Of course, starting to get worried. I mean, we've gone like six or seven weeks without giving money to Ukraine. I don't know what was up.

Friar Rod

With that, well, they they gotta keep the money laundering going somehow, right?

Rabbi Dave

Well, how's all war going? Does anybody know? I mean, it's not front page news anymore.

Friar Rod

I see little clips here and there on the Daily Mail. They talk about it, but I think Russia is still still kind of advancing involving.

Rabbi Dave

Last I heard. There was a big attack in Russia. The Ukrainians actually attacked Russia, which?

Friar Rod

So the. They did. They had some drones go and and really far in actually actually on the other side of Moscow and attacked the refinery.

Rabbi Dave

That's a long way. It is. For a drone.

Friar Rod

Yeah.

Rabbi Dave

That's almost almost insane. Anyway, I I haven't kept up on it. I I know. That's kind of a. Problem. Because it seems. Like something we should be paying attention to, but I. I'm I'm far more concerned right now with, you know, what Dylan Mulvaney is doing and stuff like that. So anyway, it's I I don't know how the war in Ukraine is going, but I know it's. Still going? And I know we're still paying for it. And I know it's going to become an issue in the presidential election between the two oldest people to ever.



Friar Rod

Run for the office. Yeah, well, and then you've got you've Putin's out there saying, hey, people, wait a minute. I've got nukes, I've got nukes, people, right. So.

Rabbi Dave

A lot of that before, though. They mean.

Friar Rod

Anybody, anybody. I've got nukes?

Rabbi Dave

So here's the here's the problem with saying that you can go, you can run around and say hey, I've got nukes. Hey, I've got. But unless you're gonna use it, nobody's gonna listen to. Yeah, because everybody already knows you have them.

Friar Rod

So what's he waiting for? I mean, you know, if he dropped a tactical one on Ukraine, wouldn't that kind of like, stop? I mean, people would be up in arms, I guess. But Ukraine is not a NATO country. So.

Rabbi Dave

So I I don't. I mean. God no. Do you think that matters to the current administration? No. If if, if Vladimir Putin dropped a nuke on Ukraine today, what do you think the United States response would be?

Friar Rod

Ohh my gosh, they probably send troops there.

Rabbi Dave

There's already troops there, we already learned.

Friar Rod

That, yeah, I know that. Of course, any conflict, there's gonna be.

Rabbi Dave

F30 fives are scouting for the we we went through all this F30 fives going oh look, there's a Russian missile over there. Here's the coordinates. Here's how to put it.

Friar Rod

Let's paint that with a laser beam, yeah.

Rabbi Dave

You push the button, but we'll do everything else. I yeah. You can't. He can't go nuke if he goes nuclear. Sorry. Nuclear. It's going to. It's going to come back on him and. I you know when this whole thing started, I was getting emails probably 2A day from people, listeners who are explaining to me that this is going to be the end of Putin. Putin's going to fall. The Russians are never gonna put up with this are gonna rebel.

Friar Rod

There's a. Some of that right now with the, with the elections going on.

Speaker

Woman still waiting for that.

Rabbi Dave

Let me guess how those elections are. Going to turn out. Kind of like North Korea.

Friar Rod

Right. It's a close race.

Rabbi Dave

It'll. Close race one personal vote against him.

Friar Rod

As well, apparently they were destroying some of the polling places they were lighting up. You know, their firebombing or lighting them on fire.

Rabbi Dave

That's that helps, that just increases his leadership, right? It increases his lead. Plus plus, that way. See if that happened here, right. You could burn up a polling box or something, and then they'd blame it on. They'd blame it on Trump. Trump. Yeah, you'd slow down the mail, so.

Speaker

No.

Friar Rod

They look, we recovered the ballots and there's five more boxes than they would actually be stored in there.

Rabbi Dave

And they're all for Biden inmates. But we couldn't count them until after two in the morning. I I can't I. I mean, I guess he could. But war is an irrational act and only a rational people commit it. Which means that Putin is already irrational. Mm-hmm. And Russia is irrational for following him. The the. Rule of thumb. Is that Russia started the war, which means that Russia will lose the war. That's the rule. The modern rule of thumb. But it isn't working out that way. And you'd think for our box that we keep sending these people, they'd be doing a better job of pushing the Russians out and they're not. Mm-hmm. And it's kind of weird to me. I don't, I don't. Rabbi Dave

Anyway, stay with. Us we'll be back with the real stuff right after this. Welcome back. I'm Dave.

Friar Rod

I am. Rod.

Rabbi Dave

So my son, whom I love dearly. Was riding with me in the car the other day. I like it when he does this. He doesn't do this very often, but sometimes he'll just wander in here and go. Dad, can we? Just.

Friar Rod

Go for a drive. So did is that. Without headphones, without. OK, that now that's a miracle.

Rabbi Dave

No headphones, no. No tablets, nothing dad. Can we just go for it? Sure. So we headed out and we actually ended up going to Walmart for some things. But at any rate, along the way, he's like. So what do you? Think was the worst marketing decision in history. This is the kind of question I get from my son and this is a good one because he has his own opinion about this.

Friar Rod

OK.

Rabbi Dave

Which involves some game that I have no.

Friar Rod

I'm I'm sure.

Rabbi Dave

Idea what is? And he tried to explain it to me, and I was like, well, I don't, I don't. I don't know.

Friar Rod

It's not No Man's Sky, so no.

Rabbi Dave

It's not just there's two games that I play now. No Man's Sky. Thanks a lot, rod, and out of the park baseball. And. That's that's this limit of my gaming at this particular point and and the ridiculous part of No Man's Sky is. And I and I have to say this, I don't feel like I'm actually doing any.

Friar Rod

You're exploring.

Rabbi Dave

I'm just running, I'm just running around seeing what there is to see. Yeah, well, keep telling me. Oh, you gotta build farms and you gotta make money and you gotta. I was chasing the Artemis character for a while. Yeah. Finally found him and murdered him. And then. Some other dude. Apollo. Yeah. Chasing him for a while. And then he just vanished. I don't know where he went. So. So now I'm just running around. Digging holes, it's just it's just Minecraft for adults, people, that's all it is. So I'm building a castle on this deserted island somewhere where there's no resources. You remember where you found the sunken freighter and you had the new? That's where I'm building my castle.

Friar Rod

To do this. Yeah, yeah. So OK.

Rabbi Dave

Anyway, so I play that I. Play out of the park.

Friar Rod

On a fallout world where there's nuclear radiation.

Rabbi Dave

Yes, there's nothing there it's. I mean it's. There, there's no resources, nothing. Every time. I need every time I need parts. I gotta go somewhere else to get them anyway. So that's the only game I play. So anyway, back to this question. What? What is the? What is the greatest marketing mistake ever made? And at the time, now keep in mind. This was almost three or four days ago. I said to him well. I think that

the Dylan Mulvaney thing for Bud Light. But I'm not convinced that that was a marketing decision. It had a marketing effect. Yeah, but I don't know that the marketing department said, hey, let's get Dylan Mulvaney to advertise our beer, cause that's not what happened. Was 1/3.

Friar Rod

Party company that was working for them that was handling the influencers right and that's something that all the companies are doing right now that they're handling well, maybe not as much but. But they're handling, you know, they're handing out these freebies for influencers just so that they can kind of promote on the backside. It's a cheap thing. It's a cheap way to get marketing done.

Rabbi Dave

Well, there's a story right now about a cruise cruise ship that's making a nine month around the world cruise. And a TikTok influencer. Who was begging Bravo television to put cameras to turn this into a reality show?

Friar Rod

Wait, that's not narcissistic at.

Rabbi Dave

All well, he was begging them to do it. I'd watch. I'd watch. And now he's gotten one of these companies to put him on the cruise. Mm-hmm. And he's going to quote, UN quote, create chaos. On TikTok I assume. Which you should probably if you're going to watch this, you probably should do it soon before it gets banned. But at any rate. I'm not sure that's a marketing decision, and I and I'm not sure that the Dylan Mulvaney thing was a marketing decision. No, it had a marketing effect I'll give you.

Friar Rod

That, yeah, well, and then there were some follow up marketing decisions based on. There were on that.

Rabbi Dave

But one of which was to bring in Peyton Manning, which you can't, you can't go wrong with Peyton Manning.

Friar Rod

Yeah, it was. It was cringe.

Rabbi Dave

Still, it was cringe, but have you ever watched Peyton Manning's commercials for anything else? He he thrives on cringe so.

Friar Rod

Sure. No good for him. He made money off that.

Rabbi Dave

So I'm cool. More money for Peyton Manning? Yeah.

Friar Rod

I love their ESPN coverage or whatever it is that they do.

Rabbi Dave

Who could who could come back tomorrow and play quarterback for the Broncos and still do better than Russell? No comment. So when it comes to actual marketing decisions, I I I had to go with. New coke. New Coke was, I don't know how many of you remember this or not. I remember it very, very well.

Friar Rod

OK, OK.

Rabbi Dave

And.

Friar Rod

I may have. I may have one up on this one. Hold on. I have to go check my browser history.

Speaker

That the color was.

Rabbi Dave

Coca-Cola was fantastic. It was perfect. It was delicious. It was refreshing. It was satisfying. And then they screwed it up and turned. It tried to turn. It into. Pepsi, which I don't care. All you people sending me, including my son, sending me notes. Going. They they, Kate. They tame. No, they don't. And they certainly didn't back before New Coke. And then it was like New Coke was trying to out Sweeten Pepsi. And of course, it turned into a marketing debacle. Which they then undid by bringing back Old Coke, which they now called Coke Classic. And then they kept making new coke for another, what, 20 years before they finally said this is stupid. And get away. With it now the problem with that is the worst marketing decision is. I'm not convinced. That it wasn't on purpose.

Friar Rod

OK.

Rabbi Dave

There's a part of me that says they screwed this up on purpose to generate. Buzz. And they got Bill Cosby to do the ads. Bill Cosby did the original new Coke ads, which of course at the time nobody knew, was a problem, but.

Friar Rod

MHM.

Rabbi Dave

Well, somebody knew that it was a problem, but nobody was saying anything about it being a problem. So I'm there's a part of me that still says that was manipulate they were doing. They they had this idea that this somehow or another, this would generate buzz. And this is back in the era of the Cola wars, which you kids, you kids today don't know nothing about the cola wars.

Friar Rod

Yeah.

Rabbi Dave

Even even Billy Joel sang about the Cola wars. At one point. They were vicious. They were terrible.

Friar Rod

So, Dave, I mean talk about the cola wars there wasn't. There was a 1992 Pepsi competition. Where they they had this number fever. I don't know if you remember this, but in the Philippines? They had this big ramp up for for number fever it and the actual contest ended up killing five people and the idea behind it was was fairly simple that the numbers would be printed on the soft drink bottle caps. Remember that were used to print it on the underneath side and then each morning and evening the local news would announce winners.

Speaker

No.

Friar Rod

So yeah, well, what? What went wrong was that. There was a printing problem and the winning numbers that they that Pepsi had chosen ended up going if they printed over 800,000 winning numbers in the Philippines. And of course the Philippines, you know, is all. They're all freaking out. They're all thinking that they're winning. And then Pepsi said, oh, no, wait a minute. No, no, there was a problem. We we didn't do this. And so there were riots when Pepsi said no, we're not. Going to pay? And it was they promised people to become millionaires and they ended up Pepsi ended up losing. 32 billion. Off of that.

Rabbi Dave

Again, a marketing decision or. A technical problem. There was a technical.

Friar Rod

Problem, but I think it was. It was another bad marketing decision to say no, wait a second, we can't pay that.

Speaker

Right.

Rabbi Dave

Almost as bad as when they did the win win a jet competition or something and the guy won the jet and they said, Oh no, sorry, that's not. And then they ended up out, did they ended up having to give.

Speaker

Yeah.

Rabbi Dave

Him the jet or something? I don't remember. Hey, all these decisions were. We're dumb and weird and companies make mistakes. Bands are notorious for this. Bands make bad marketing decisions all the time. Yeah, yeah. And then you got to sit there and listen to these interviews on MTV. Back when MTV actually did music and tell you. About ohh the the the. The VJ would have to interview him about how great their new album was and everybody knew. It was crap. And everybody would have to be.

Speaker

Mm-hmm.

Rabbi Dave

But I didn't. I I started thinking about this and this terms of what my son was asking me. And by the time I got back, my Xbox was my inbox was for my Xbox, my inbox.

Friar Rod

Your eats. What is your Xbox?

Rabbi Dave

Well, full of articles about Tyson's foods. A Tyson Foods is. One of the biggest. Chicken companies in the world, if not certainly in the country if. Not the world. Very big down where where I was from in Georgia but.

Friar Rod



That's so big in the valley.

Speaker

But.

Friar Rod

Cause we have Foster Farms, right?

Rabbi Dave

Right. Who I once had to interview a Congress person who shall remain nameless, but his initials are Dennis Cardoza. Who presented my producer with a list of five questions about Foster Farms. They were chicken. He presented my producer with a list of five questions and very specific instructions that if I deviated from these five questions, he would enter in the interview.

Friar Rod

OK.

Rabbi Dave

And they were all about injecting salt water into chickens. To make them plumper. OK. And I thought to myself and I. Was still pretty new. With this bills and I said to myself. Well, that's just stupid. Nobody's going to listen to that. And so I asked the first question. He read me his answer. And so then I said, now let's talk about this. And he hung up. Friar Rod

Friar Rod

Rabbi Dave

Tyson Foods is one of the biggest. Food companies in America, they have plants in Iowa, Virginia, Arkansas, Indiana, Missouri. They want to double immigrant hires to 84,000 people this year going to pay them \$16.00 and some odd cents a minute and higher.

Friar Rod

Since a minute, an hour, whatever.

Rabbi Dave

Yeah, an hour. And and hire lawyers for them to get their immigration status.

Friar Rod

OK. OK. OK.

Rabbi Dave

Then now you might say. To yourself? Well, that's seems. I mean, they're here so.

Friar Rod

Yeah, really, the question comes this, you know, whose jobs are they displacing it?

Rabbi Dave

Well, that's the problem. See if they were just hiring these people. You'd go OK, but at the same time, this company announced that they were shutting down a plant in Iowa, laying off something like I don't remember 14115 hundred. American workers and eventually replacing them with these undocumented. I'm sorry, illegal immigrants whom they are also going to hire attorneys.

Friar Rod

Yeah.

Rabbi Dave

And for reasons that they.

Friar Rod

So it can be legal, right?

Rabbi Dave

12176 out of a town. Of 8000 so to be. To be clear here the marketing decision. I mean Tyson Foods is well known for supporting leftist progressive. Mm-hmm. Democrat candidates. Well known for them. But here's the question in today's world. Why in God's name would you put out? A press release saying you're doing this.

Friar Rod

Some DI position person. In in a position said, hey, this looks good. This is good news.

Rabbi Dave

OK. Here's you see. You're not getting my my. My facial intensity here.

Friar Rod

Ohh yeah, I'm sort of getting the yeah with the with the.

Rabbi Dave

Speaker

Friar Rod

Something.

Rabbi Dave

All beer tastes the. Same. Especially when you're talking about this mass produced.

Friar Rod

Rabbi Dave

They're all, they're all the same. So if I'm not gonna buy bud light because I don't wanna support that, I can buy Coors Light and get the same thing. And for some reason, the people who run Bud Light didn't seem to grasp that concept. Beer is fungible.

Speaker

Mm-hmm.

Friar Rod

Well, so they they're buying modello now. Which is great.

Speaker

Nice.

Rabbi Dave

To be honest, the few Modell's. I kind of like that. Yeah, I'm not a huge. Not a huge beer fan, but.

Friar Rod

They were actually better.

Rabbi Dave

I did like Modelo Gold is that.

Friar Rod

I think so. Yeah. Yeah, I don't drink madella. So anyway.

Rabbi Dave

What was I gonna say? Is chicken fungible?

Friar Rod

Not really.

Rabbi Dave

Doesn't seem like it would.

Friar Rod

Right. Well, the ticket manufacturers are maybe.

Rabbi Dave

Right. But they're not all. They're not like gasoline. They're not all buying the same material, and they're not all buying it from the same supplier. They're actually processing it themselves and and. So I don't know the chicken is fungible. So I'm looking at the score. And as as Tyson just literally committed Harry Carey, right in front of us. On the Internet.

Friar Rod

Maybe, but this is this is Foster Farms opportunity to expand their market.

Rabbi Dave

Ohh my gosh. Do you Can you imagine being in the boardroom at Foster Farms this morning going?  
Hmm. Opportunity has not.

Friar Rod

Let's go. Move, move. People move.

Rabbi Dave

Friar Rod

That's what.

Rabbi Dave

Women.

Friar Rod

Friar Rod

Rabbi Dave

Friar Rod

Friar Rod

Rabbi Dave

Friar Rod

Anyway, I I've done pay per views before and usually rarely is a paper. This is why when you buy a pay-per-view, you get the whole card, because if you just buy it for one. Fight it's usually.

Friar Rod

It's not worth it.

Rabbi Dave

But I did back in the day we bought pay per views. We'd we'd all pool our money and go over to whoever had an apartment. Yeah, and and do it that way and. Was it the Jerry Cooney? Yvette not vanderhall, if you. What was that guy's name? I can't think of his name now. Anyway, Jerry Cooney was supposed to be the. Great white hope he got.

Friar Rod

I'm not. I'm not a huge boxing fan. I don't mind it, but.

Rabbi Dave

He got all. Yeah, and it didn't last long. Anyway, the point being that. I do enjoy it and but I'm I'm I'm fascinated by this because I'm. Their reaction to Mike Tyson's video is it's all fake. Ohh, you're not that great. You're not this whatever. And I'm like, I'm notice you're not standing there. Yeah, cause. I wouldn't stand even with all that padding. That dude is backing up. Friar Rod

Well, totally up to you, my friend.

Rabbi Dave

You don't want to go. In on it. With me, you'd have to come up here to watch it, but so I'm sure at \$300 million purse, it's going to be freaking expensive. Friar Rod

Inquiring minds want to know.

Rabbi Dave

And I've got a minute to. Kill rare neurological disorder that most often causes progressive muscle stiffness. So there you. Go. I guess I guess her performances on stage weren't necessarily.

Friar Rod

She's not dancing on stage, that's.

Rabbi Dave

For sure, she never was.

Friar Rod

I mean, because she's got stiff person syndrome.

Rabbi Dave

There you go. Anyway, surgery date is set for me April 12th so.

Speaker

OK.

Rabbi Dave
